

HOW WE HELP

Complaint Investigation

We identify, investigate, and help resolve complaints made by, or for, individuals receiving long-term care services.

Self-Advocacy

We help individuals speak in their own voices about their care.

Community-Based Care and Services

We help people on Choices for Care receive longterm care services in the community.

Program Activities

We visit long-term care facilities to talk with residents and monitor conditions, we educate providers about residents' rights, and we provide information to the public about long-term care services and options.

Systems Advocacy

We help identify problem areas in the long-term care system and then advocate for improvements.

Policy Advocacy

We advocate for laws and policies to improve the care and quality of life of Vermonters receiving long-term care in facility settings and in the community through Choices for Care.
